

## Grading Standards

- All classes will be used to determine GPA and class rank except for driver's ed., P.E., and other classes that receive a 'blanket' grade.
- All grades for Carnegie Units in grades 7-12 will be recorded as a numerical grade.
- Categories **for each grading period** are:
- The final average **for each nine week grading period** is figured as follows:
  - Checkpoints - 15%
  - Minor - 35%
  - Major - 50%
- The final average **for each semester** is figured as follows:
  - Nine weeks average - 50%
  - Nine weeks average - 50%
  - Example 1st nine weeks = 83, 2nd nine weeks equal 91, semester average = 87 semester average
- The final average of a full year course is figured as follows:
  - ~~○ First Semester Average - 40%~~
  - ~~○ Second Semester Average - 40%~~
  - ~~○ Final Exam - 20%~~
  - First semester average - 45%
  - Second semester average - 45%
  - Final exam - 10%
- The final average for a semester course is figured as follows:
  - ~~○ Nine week average - 40%~~
  - ~~○ Nine week average - 40%~~
  - ~~○ Final exam - 20%~~
  - Nine week average - 45%
  - Nine week average - 45%
  - Final exam - 10%
- AP classes and Dual Enrollment college courses are multiplied by a factor of **1.10** to determine the student's grade.
- Scores in Honors classes are multiplied by a factor of **1.05** to determine the numerical grade.

## Honors Options

The minimum requirements to apply for placement in the Honors classes are listed by subject below:

### Compacted Math for 7th graders

Students in these classes are selected based on prior grades, teacher input, and a placement test.
